Get ready for 2025-26 grants

The next round of applications for the Events and Festivals Grant Program and Community Funding Scheme are expected to open soon.

Whether you have a project that will benefit the community in the Macedon Ranges, or an event that will attract visitors and benefit local businesses, we would love to hear from you.

Information sessions and workshops

To assist you with your application, we will hold information sessions for both grant streams.

Small Project Grants

Small Project Grants support community programs and initiatives that benefit residents of the Macedon Ranges and help achieve Council Plan goals.

These grants of up to \$3,000 are open to community groups throughout the year (subject to overall program allocation) and aim to support local needs; projects that are unlikely to be funded by other Council funding programs: and Council Plan priorities.

Enviro/Climate grant recipients

At its December 2024 Council Meeting, Council endorsed funding recommendations for successful recipients for the Environment Group Support Grant **Program and Community Climate Action Grants** 2024-2025.

The 2024-2025 Environment Group Support Grants enable just under \$70,000 to flow through to the shire's Landcare and Friends groups across three grant categories: Group Support, Strategic Weed Partnership Program and Biolink Boost. The new Community Climate Action Grant stream is funding an additional \$33,000 in grassroots climate action projects.

The new Community Climate Action grants and the Biolink Boost grant stream of the Environment Group Support Grants are co-funded in partnership with Macedon Ranges Community Enterprises (MRCE) and Community Bank Gisborne and District. MRCE will match Council's funding to the amount of \$40,000.

Projects and works

Kids win with new kinder and MCH

Families and children across Lancefield and surrounds now have access to a brand new modular children's centre, with three kindergarten rooms and a Maternal and Child Health consulting room.

The new Lancefield Children's Centre, delivered by the Victorian Government's Victorian School Building Authority through a Building Blocks Capacity Grant, offers weekday kindergarten to up to 99 children at a time.

Additional grant funding from the Victorian Government provided state-of-the-art equipment and educational tools, while Council funding has contributed towards the building's furnishing as well as improved environmental and sustainable design elements.

Council's Maternal and Child Health service will also operate from the new Lancefield site on Mondays.

Sports Precinct's next stage

Planning for the next stage of the Macedon Ranges Sports Precinct in New Gisborne is progressing. The Western site (Sports Hub) is scheduled to deliver three additional sports courts, four gender-neutral amenities, and expanded parking. The Eastern site (Pavilion) is planned to include a new AFL/cricket oval, two outdoor netball courts, and additional car parking.

Funded with \$15 million under the Australian Government's Priority Community Infrastructure Program, in addition to a \$2 million Council contribution, detailed designs for the second stage are currently being finalised with the aim to award a works contract later this year.

Council is continuing to advocate for external funding sources to fund a third stage of the project, expected to cost \$15.5 million and include other upgrades to more fully realise the precinct's master plan.

New netball facilities underway

Work to deliver new netball upgrades at both Woodend and Kyneton are now underway, providing fit-for-purpose facilities and supporting growing participation in the sport.

To replace the existing deteriorating netball court at Gilbert Gordon Oval in Woodend, two new netball courts are being constructed adjacent to the social room building, making them more visible and accessible from existing reserve facilities.

The works have been funded through the Victorian Government's Local Sports Infrastructure Fund, a budget allocation from Council and a contribution from the Woodend Hesket Football Netball Club.

At Kyneton Showgrounds, works are also underway on a new pavilion to kick off a multi-staged process, with these works to continue this year and followed by a second stage that will enable the construction of two new courts prior to the start of next year's netball season.

Temporary facilities will be in place during construction of the new pavilion, which will feature modern amenities including change rooms, accessible toilets, a first aid room and storage areas.

The Victorian Government has committed \$1.5 million towards construction of the new netball facilities in Kyneton through a Community Sport and Recreation Grant, with Council committing ~\$1.4 million.

Both projects align with Council's Fair Access Policy and Council Plan priorities to provide fit-for-use infrastructure and encourage active lifestyles.

Building back better in 2024-25

A number of road and bridge projects outlined in Council's Budget 2024-25 have already been completed, including:

Five Mile Creek footbridge, Romsey

Refurbished an ageing footbridge on the east side of Main Street, just north of Murphy Street, including replacement of the timber decking with a high-strength, slip-resistant, fibre-reinforced polymer material; and new steel balustrade to meet current standards.

Pedestrian safety improvements, Riddells Creek

Delivering three new raised wombat crossings around the main shopping precinct, and road changes to prioritise through-traffic along Sutherlands Road.

Viewing platform, Kyneton

Work to rebuild the flood-damaged viewing platform located along the Campaspe River and just off Campaspe Place, including incorporating seats and adding a new shared path connection to connect to an existing nearby path.

Lauriston Road, Kyneton

1.2km of road reconstructed between Youngs Road and Sebastopol Road, funded through the Australian Government's Road to Recovery Program.

On the works radar for the remainder of the year include:

Jacksons Creek footbridge, Gisborne

Replacing a key pedestrian connection between Dixon Field and the Gisborne Botanic Gardens, closed for public safety following the October 2022 flood event.

Fersfield Road, Gisborne

About 600m of road reconstruction from east of Morrison Road to Bloomfield Road, including the completion of missing shared path link between Sheedy Road and Morrison Road, funded through the Australian Government's Infrastructure Investment Program.

Mount Gisborne Road, Gisborne

1.3km of road rehabilitation from Runnymede Lane towards Couangalt Road, funded through the Australian Government's Local Road and Community Infrastructure Program (Phase 4).

Resource recovery

Register for orange bags

Heading to one of Council's customer service, fitness or aquatic centres? Don't forget to pick up your FREE soft plastic orange collection bags from the front desk and start recycling soft plastic from home!

How do I register?

As this is part of a national trial, you will need to register to participate. You can use your smart phone to scan a QR code and complete a short survey at the facility, then you will receive your starter pack (including letter and 20 collection bags). If you don't have a smart phone, you can register and pick up the orange collection bags from Council's customer service centres.

The soft plastic recycling program is available to everyone in the shire!

How do I use the bags?

All soft and 'scrunchable' plastic can be recycled. Collect it in the orange bag, and when the bag is filled tight like a basketball, tie it up and place it in your yellow-lidded recycling bin for collection. The rest of your recyclables should remain loose in the bin.

How do I know if it is soft plastic?

Do the scrunch test! Does the plastic item scrunch easily into the palm of your hand and not bounce back into shape? Then it's soft plastic and can go in your orange collection bag. If the plastic item is rigid (like a milk bottle, biscuit or meat tray) and bounces back into shape once you un-scrunch, then it's not soft plastic and cannot go in the orange bag. There is also a list of accepted items on our website for reference.

Remember, you don't need a special bin for your orange bag, just place it straight into your recycling bin at home. For more information, visit mrsc.vic.gov.au/soft-plastics-trial

Waste audit results

Council recently initiated an independent shire-wide kerbside waste audit. A total of four tonnes/50,000 litres of incoming organics, recycling, and landfill materials were analysed for weight and contamination (items in the incorrect bin).

The audit included 125 properties for each stream (total of 375 bins) randomly selected from regional towns and areas within the Macedon Ranges.

The audit found:

- Each household produced an average of 5.97kg (55.05L) of rubbish/general waste (red lid bins) per week. The contamination rate was 17.2 per cent by weight (31.5 per cent by volume), with recyclable and FOGO items found to be the main contaminants in bins.
- Each household produced an average of 3.1kg (80.4L) of recycling per week (yellow lid bins). The contamination rate was 25 per cent by weight (13.8 per cent by volume), with landfill items found to be the main contaminant in recycling bins.
- Each household produced an average of 13.9kg (126.4L) of mixed organics per week (green lid bins). The contamination rate was 2.5 per cent by weight (4 per cent by volume). Food waste in non-compostable packaging was found to be the main contaminant.

Preventing reusable materials from going to landfill is the central focus of Council's Waste and Resource Recovery Management Strategy 2021-2026. When items are put in the wrong bin, it often results in more items being sent to landfill that could have otherwise been recycled.

Roadside conservation guideposts



Did you know that roadsides play an important role in supporting our local native plants and animals? Council is excited to be enacting an action within the Roadside Conservation Management Plan 2021 by installing conservation guideposts along roadsides with significant native vegetation throughout the shire.

Roadside reserves are essential habitat corridors which protect vegetation and provide local wildlife with food, shelter, and protection from predators. Many of these native plant and animal species are protected by state and federal laws, highlighting the need for conservation.

If you've noticed these new guideposts installed around the shire or near your property, it means you are in a significant environmental area. These markers serve as an indication of a heightened level of conservation efforts rolling out within the area, which could include tighter controls of identified noxious weeds and ensuring essential fire mitigation in these sensitive areas.

You can play an active role in helping to protect these areas by reporting any guideposts that appear to be removed or damaged.

Restoration funding secured

Council is thrilled to have successfully secured \$838,295 over the next three years to improve a range of riparian grasslands, woodlands and forests plant communities in and around Gisborne and Macedon townships.

With the funding focusing on the upper Maribyrnong catchment, this project aims to improve the environmental health of the catchment's headwaters.

Funded by the Australian Government's Natural Heritage Trust under the Urban Rivers and Catchments Program with the in-kind support of Council, this project will actively benefit native animals including the Gang-gang Cockatoo and platypus, whilst strengthening various native plant communities by enabling wide-spread revegetation, weed and pest management and establishing an innovative monitoring program.

The project will build on past works, whilst securing further investment into the conservation and regeneration of Jacksons Creek, Howey Creek and Bunjil Creek in Gisborne, Djirri Djirri Waterway Reserve in Gisborne South and Nursery Road Reserve in Macedon.

Indigenous art brought to life at kindergartens

Aboriginal artist and Traditional Owner of Victoria's Woi-Wurrung Wurundjeri and Yorta-Yorta language groups, Simone Thomson has created new artwork for the children and families at Manna Gum Family and Children's Centre and Swinburne Children's Centre in Gisborne.

'Gathering Circle' has been painted in the playground at Manna Gum Family and Children's Centre to represent the children of Manna Gum gathering in their place of learning and knowledge. Connected circles represent the journey of the children coming to their place of learning, with mounds around the central circle symbolising the community. Cross hatching lines represent the mountains of the Macedon Ranges, Wurundjeri Country.

The artwork for Swinburne Avenue was created with inspiration from Geboor, Macedon Ranges. The mountains are depicted by the arced mounds along the flowing water that symbolises the surrounding creeks and rivers.

From the bird's eye view, a person is represented by the 'U' or 'n' symbol. This is the shape a person makes whilst sitting on the ground, with their knees crossed. Gathering circles represent the meeting place of Swinburne Avenue Children's Centre, and its community of children and families.

Gum leaves from Country represent the traditional custodians of the lands and waterways in which Swinburne Avenue Children's Centre sits, and symbolise caring for country and our environment, and the growth of children in their education journey tracks. With all Council kindergartens now offering 15 hours for both three and four year old kindergarten, our early years community have been exploring ways to celebrate indigenous culture with respect to the Reconciliation Action Plan. We will continue to discover how artwork and storytelling can be integrated into the learning experience.

Youth Climate Group

In partnership with VicHealth, Council is launching a Youth Climate Group in 2025 and we're inviting keen young people to register their interested to be involved.

Young people in Victoria continue to show leadership, skills, knowledge and the desire to engage in grassroots climate action and Council wants to help. The Youth Climate Group will create a safe, inclusive space for young people to take practical and youth-led action against climate change in the Macedon Ranges. This group will be provided upskilling opportunities on effectively running community groups and workshops on implementing projects that create real difference.

Automatic renewals arrive!

Pet registration renewals

Pet registration renewals are due by 10 April 2025. Dogs and cats must be registered annually with Council. This is a legal requirement, and more importantly, keeping your pet registration current is the best way to ensure our rangers can return lost pets quickly to their rightful owner.

Registration fees help fund animal services that help protect pets, people and our environment. There are a number of ways you can renew your registration including in person at Council service centre, by mail, BPay or online.

Rates instalments

Rates and charges can be paid in four instalments by no later than the due date, or for the 2024-25 financial year as a single payment by 30 September 2024. Instalment reminder notices will be sent prior to each instalment date.

The remaining instalment date for 2025 is: 31 May 2025

You can pay your rates via BPay View[®], online with Visa or Mastercard at
mrsc.vic.gov.au/payments, direct debit, Australia Post, mail, Centrepay or in person at a Council customer service centre during opening hours.

If you have any questions about rates payment methods, or if you have difficulty paying your rates on time, call customer service on 5422 0333. Council has a Financial Hardship Policy that outlines options for ratepayers who are experiencing genuine financial hardship, while there may also be rate exemptions available under the Local Government Act (i.e. land used exclusively for charitable purposes).
