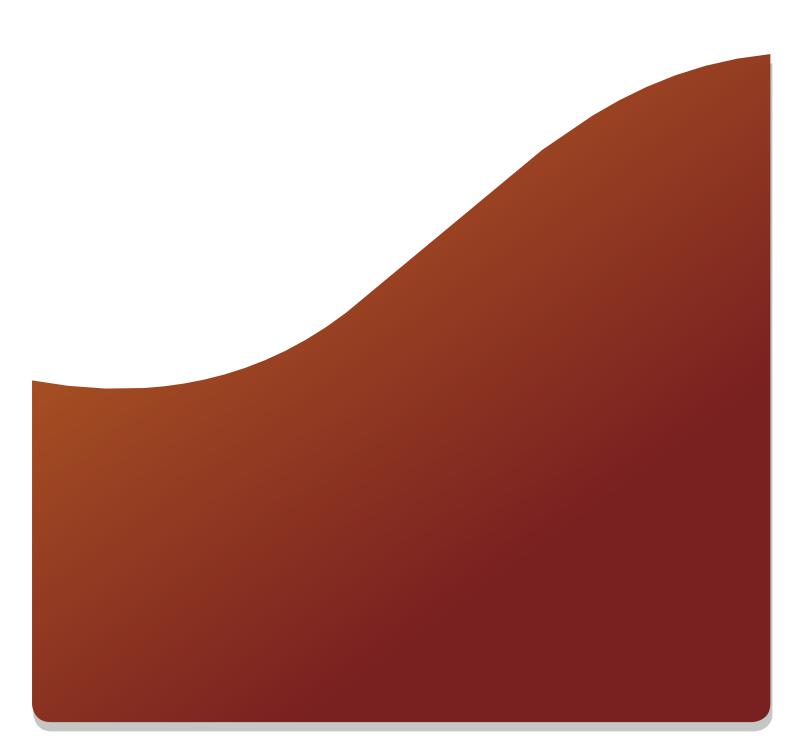

Summary

This report clarifies cost escalations on infrastructure projects for Stage 1 of the Macedon Ranges Regional Sports Precinct (MRRSP). It seeks budget transfer across Stages 2 and 1 to balance the budget and deliver the full scope of both stages within the allocated budget.

The report also details why this needs to be considered in an Unscheduled Council Meeting.

Recommendation

That Council:

- 1. Adopts the following changes to the Financial Year 2023/24 budget relating to the following projects:
 - a) Macedon Ranges Regional Sports Precinct Stage 1: Increase the budget by \$700,000, transferring the budget from Stage 2
 - b) Macedon Ranges Regional Sports Precinct Stage 2: Decrease the budget by \$700,000, transferring the budget to Stage 1
- 2. Notes that recommendation 1 (above) does not impact the total budget allocation for the Macedon Ranges Regional Sports Precinct project.

Background

The Macedon Ranges Regional Sports Precinct (MRRSP) is the largest project undertaken by Council. It is split into several stages to allow construction and early opportunity for community use instead of awaiting total budget allocations and construction. Stage One is on track to deliver the three-court Stadium in April 2024 and the single oval and pavilion in May 2024. The intersection upgrade is the one remaining component requiring construction.

Council successfully novated the construction contract for the two main components to Monaco Hickey when the Lloyd Group went into administration. The delivery of the intersection works is separate from the Monaco Hickey contract.

The intersection works were tendered in December 2023, and officers have identified a technical budget shortfall.

This report identifies how this shortfall can be addressed without impacting other projects and requires journalling the budget between stages one and two.

Discussion

Two items have resulted in additional costs to the project relating to the intersection works. These are unbudgeted utility works required for moving Telstra and NBN infrastructure. This has also resulted in increased consultant costs.

Additionally, as Stage 1 progressed, Stage 2 works were identified that should be paid for from the Stage 2 budget. The cost of these works is in the Stage 1 accounts.

Tendering of Stage 2 Design Consultation is under review. However, officers have identified that the amount set aside for the contract and contingencies is higher than needed. The Stage 2 budget can be reduced, and the Stage 1 budget can be increased, thereby balancing the budget.

This recommendation results in a Stage 1 budget of \$19,143,840 and a Stage 2 budget of \$800,000 in the 2023/2024 Capital Works Program budget. These changes will have no impact on next year's budget processes.

This report is separate from the standard *Capital Works Monitoring Report* and does not change any ongoing reconciliation of the Capital Works Program budget.

This report is presented in an Unscheduled Council Meeting due to the timing of the next Scheduled Council Meeting (28 February 2024) and the need to complete as much work as possible before mid-winter on the Macedon Ranges Regional Sports Precinct. The further into winter works are scheduled to finish, the higher the delay and financial risk is due to rain delays and inclement weather. Delays will result in increased costs and potentially impact the final quality of the work. They will also extend the user experience of people travelling through the area, as traffic impact will continue longer.

By considering this matter in an unscheduled meeting Council ensures the best quality finish for the construction, reduces the impact on road users and potentially saves money.
